But they didn't. After hours and days of arm-twisting, they rammed an abominable spending bill through Congress that funds Obama's Democrat voter-importation program.

Majority Leader elect Mitch McConnell (Kentucky) and Speaker of the House John Boehner (Ohio) spent millions of dollars in campaign ads saying they were going to stand against illegal immigration and dismantle Obamacare - yet in a two week period of time rather than push for a short term continuing resolution that would fund the federal government into February they lock-stepped with the president in funding a trillion dollar Obama budget that underwrote Obamacare, illegal immigration, the wiles of the EPA and other liberal causes.

What happens when an entire generation forgets?

One of the most heart wrenching verses of the entire Old Testament is found in Judges 2:10 "After that whole generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation grew up, who knew neither the Lord nor what he had done for Israel." (NIV) This new generation, we are told in the next few verses, did evil in the eyes of the Lord, forsaking the God of their fathers, following the gods of the nations around them.

In the Bible, the length of a generation was 40 years. If that is the case, within 40 years after the passing of the "Joshua Generation" an entire new generation emerged whose parents never bothered to tell them about God and what He had done in the past. Without recording the historical facts and rehearsing the personal testimonies to the next generation, it should not surprise us how past events, no matter how significant, quickly fade away and become meaningless to succeeding generations.

This "new generation" that begins in Judges 2:10, sadly illustrates for us what happens when an entire generation forgets God and what He has done. People begin to fashion idols and seek messiahs to help them in their times of trouble. The increase of idolatry naturally increases the level of violence and immorality in society (Rom.1:28). And the level of evil increases with every succeeding generation in a society that has forgotten about God and what He has done. In the case of the "Judges Generation", the Israelite society had become so perverse that they began to look like Sodom and Gomorrah (Judges 19).

Do you remember what life was like here in the United States a generation ago? If you are old enough to remember how things were 40-50 years ago, you might remember a time when it was safe for children to walk home from school without the slightest fear of being molested. You might remember a time when doors went unlocked, or when the 8:00 PM family hour on television was truly "family friendly". What has happened to us as a nation and as a society over the past 40 years? Why is my grandson presented the perverse comedy show "Two Broke Girls" during the family hour, when 40 years earlier, I was watching family friendly shows like "The Brady Bunch" at 8:00 PM?

We could list several reasons for this 40 year decline in our culture such as Supreme Court cases that have increasingly chipped away at our Judeo-Christian values in the public arena. There has also been an insidious movement to rewrite our national history expunging all Biblical references and Christian history from our text books and national monuments. We could even add to our list the hypocrisy of our political leaders and the public immorality of our cultural heroes and icons. But I want to add another reason that may come as a shock to some of us. I blame the Christian Church.

We are raising an entire generation of young people who are Biblically and spiritually illiterate. Over the past 20-30 years, the church has forgotten the Great Commission. Instead of going out into our neighborhoods, we expect our neighbors to enter our ever-growing church facilities to hear the Gospel message. This makes as much sense as a farmer who spends countless hours and resources to ready the fields for planting, but then dumps the seed on the floor of the barn.

I have a news flash for today's Church living in a post-Christian culture—many of our neighbors don't have a clue of what the church is even about? Some of them don't even know who Jesus is or that the church is all about Jesus. Some young people would no more step into a church than they would a VFW hall. A whole new generation of people are growing up here in the United States who will likely never learn about God and what He has done through His

Son Jesus unless the church awakens and moves out of its comfort zone, sowing the seed of the gospel extravagantly as in Jesus' parable of the sower. Why should this younger generation look for hope and meaning through the idols of this world when there are still thousands of churches and Christians in every state and city in America who have an eternal message of hope and love to share?

Join with me in praying for the Church. Pray that the Lord will move with His Spirit to revive the American Church as He has in the past. There have been at least five Great Awakenings in this country, each has propelled the Church into the streets with the Gospel message, transforming the culture and shaping the history of our nation. If God was able to breathe new life into the dying churches of ages past, transform entire communities, and launch new missionary movements . . . why should we doubt his ability to do it again in our day?

We Don't Need a New Kind of Family

ABC Family's slogan, "A New Kind of Family," will be given a whole new meaning when its planned reality television show, *My Transparent Life*, airs in the near future.

From the creative minds of Ryan Seacrest Productions comes the story of one boy's difficult family life as his parents get divorced ... and his dad transitions from being "Charlie" to being "Carly."

That's right, the network Pat Robertson founded to be a safe place for family entertainment will soon be preaching the gospel of transgender sexuality to America's youth.

Probably best known as the host of the competitive singing show, "American Idol," Seacrest has developed a media empire, including his own production company. "At RSP, we love family stories, and we couldn't be more excited that ABC Family is helping us share this heartwarming story of how an ordinary teenager grapples with a challenging and unexpected family situation. We feel audiences will find Ben's story relatable on a number of different levels, because at the end of the day, family is family unconditionally."

The Hollywood Reporter points out that ABC Family is not the first to broach this once-taboo subject:

"My Transparent Life also comes as transgender-themed programming is on the rise. Amazon's Transparent — a comedy about a father (Jeffrey Tambor) transitioning to a woman and how his three grown children navigate the change — is already being hailed as one of the year's best series. Orange Is the New Black's Laverne

Cox also earned an Emmy nomination for her role on the Netflix original, marking the first openly transgender actor to do so. HBO is also teaming with exec producer Lena Dunham for a documentary about the transgender clients of a bespoke Brooklyn tailor. Not to be outdone, MTV has Laverne Cox Presents: The T Word, a documentary about seven transgender youths as well as scripted comedy Faking It, which features one of primetime's first intersex characters. Meanwhile, corporate sibling VH1 has enlisted Tyra Banks to produce a transgender docuseries called TransAmerica, which chronicles eight transgender millennial women."

While the existence of this trend is disturbing, ABC Family's candidate is especially concerning based on the network's name and pedigree. How can a network built on the family use its programming to advance the disintegration of that foundational unit of society?

There is a term for divorced parents and a transgender father; it's "broken family."

All of this comes in the midst of the slow build of an undercurrent of the idea of gender identity, and especially gender reassignment surgery. There has even been criticism of the practice from those who have undergone the procedure and now live with deep regret.

One example, a British man named Matthew Attonley underwent surgery and other procedures to become "Chelsea." He now wishes to live again as a man.

"I have always longed to be a woman, but no amount of surgery can give me an actual female body and I feel like I am living a lie

It is exhausting putting on make-up and wearing heels all the time. Even then I don't feel I look like a proper woman...

I have realised it would be easier to stop fighting the way I look naturally and accept that I was born a man physically."

Another example is Dan "Danielle Berry"

Bunten who had sex reassignment surgery in 1992. Here is his advice to those considering the operation:

"Don't do it! That's my advice...

I can speak the transgender party line that I was a female trapped in a male body and I remember feeling this way since I was 4. But, it's never that easy if you look at it sincerely and without preconception. There's little question that a mid-life crisis, a divorce and a cancer scare were involved in at least the timing of my sexchange decision. To be completely honest at this point (3 yrs post-op) is not easy, however, I'm not sure I would do it again. I'm now concerned that much of what I took as a gender dysfunction might have been nothing more than a neurotic sexual obsession..."

And just one more example is Walt Heyer who had the surgery and came to regret it.

In his own words, "My perfectly good body parts had been amputated. Years of looking like and living as a woman did not bring the promised treatment or relief. I still suffered from psychological issues which needed to be properly diagnosed and treated.

I turned to Jesus Christ, who surrounded me with His loving people. Through their unconditional love, I finally received treatment for dissociative disorder and now I am restored as a father, husband and man."

Walt found grace in the eyes of the Lord and now runs SexChangeRegret.org which argues against the validity of transgender "orientation."

Will ABC Family's and these other network's new programs touch on these perspectives?

I think we all know the answer to that.

Do We Really Live in a Rape Culture?

What is Rape Culture? Buzzfeed asks, and I position my cursor over the link, ready to learn. After all, feminists have spoken a lot about America's supposed rape culture, especially on college campuses, over the past few weeks.

The controversy came to a head with a Rolling Stone article about a University of Virginia rape victim - a case which was later shown to be very poorly investigated by the reporter and which claims showed serious discrepancies. Nevertheless, the article inspired "soul-searching" on the part of that and other universities in regards to their campus-life.

"'Rape culture' is a culture in which sexual violence is considered the norm—in which people aren't taught not to rape, but are taught not to be raped." Rape culture, I think we can all agree, is a bad thing. The question, then is, are we living in one?

The problem with this charge by feminists, as with those of race-baiters, is that it paints too broad a spectrum of culture as villains. While virtually everyone agrees that it would be wrong for a police-officer to shoot an unarmed, surrendering suspect, no matter how deep their tan, when an officer of one color shoots a suspect of another color, everyone who is the same color as the shooter is labeled a racist. The resulting defensiveness is simply absorbed as proof of racism.

Similarly, when a woman is the victim in an alcohol fueled gang rape (whether the Rolling Stone story is accurate or not, such cases have doubtless occurred), and the term "rape culture" is introduced, all men are labeled as potential rapists, and the resulting defensiveness is absorbed as proof of this "rape culture."

Whether ours is a "rape culture" must depend on what we mean by "sexual violence." Buzzfeed points to a Cosmopolitan article which presents an expanded definition, adding to the traditional and terrifying idea of intercourse with a gun to the victim's head, for example.

"'Gray rape is a sexual encounter that falls 'somewhere between consent and denial,' where 'both parties are unsure of who wanted what.'"

This may be one of the few instances where Cosmopolitan is qualified to define something, particularly as it seems to be a term they have coined (and which many feminists reject).

"Many experts feel that gray rape is in fact often a consequence of today's hookup culture: lots of partying and flirting, plenty of alcohol, and ironically, the idea that women can be just as bold and adventurous about sex as men are. How can something so potentially empowering become so damaging...?

A generation ago, it was easier for men and women to understand what constituted rape because the social rules were clearer. Men were supposed to be the ones coming on to women, and women were said to be looking for relationships, not casual sex.

But those boundaries and rules have been loosening up for decades, and now lots of women feel it's perfectly okay to go out looking for a hookup or to be the aggressor, which may turn out fine for them — unless the signals get mixed or misread."

In Professor Alan Bloom's classic, "The Closing of the American Mind," (which I'm on my second attempt to get through,) he spends some time on the conflict between sexual liberty and feminism.

"The sexual revolution marched under the banner of freedom; feminism under that of equality. Although they went arm in arm for a while, their differences eventually put them at odds with each other, as [Frances de] Toqueville said freedom and equality always would be."

The feminist taking part in "hook-up culture" on campus demands at once sexual liberty and sexual restraint.

I hope the reader understands at this point that it is not my desire to blame the victims of rape, "gray" or otherwise. I am not blaming the women that" feel it's perfectly okay to go out looking for a hookup" for their assaults. In the case that men have such a right, women do too, but our current sexual climate is good for no one. I blame the whole system.

The point is not that we have a rape culture, but that we have a culture absorbed in sex. It's not that sexual violence is the norm; it's that public sexuality is the norm. The sexual revolution accomplished some good - sex is not shameful, and ought to be enjoyed - in its intended context. The problem which feminism and the sexual revolution have both saddled us with is the removing of any such context.

As Alan Bloom later explained, "Libertinism allows for what even Rousseau called the greatest pleasure. <u>But in making sex easy, it can trivialize, deeroticize and demystify sexual relations."</u>

The problem on our college campuses and in the culture at large is that sex is everywhere; it's at the center of everything; it IS everything - it's the center of virtually every advertising campaign, every election, every rising and falling star, ... and that makes it nothing.

As Bloom recounts in one anecdote, "I once asked a class how it could be that not too long ago parents would have said, 'Never darken our door again,' to wayward daughters, whereas now they have rarely protest when boyfriends sleep over in their homes. A very nice, very normal, young woman responded, 'Because it's no big deal.'"

Not to advocate disowning wayward children, but if the fruit of the sexual revolution is that sex is "no big deal," is that really progress? Can we really say that

men and women have flourished as a result of this cheapening of sex?

In terms of the present controversy, when the act is considered by the culture in general to be "no big deal," should we be expected to be incensed when it is forced on someone who doesn't want it?

The truth is that sex IS a big deal. It is a big deal because its misuse can ruin a person's life and leave them feeling violated and scarred

While Christians are often maligned as being anti-sex, the truth is we don't think less of sex than the world does, but MORE of it. Today's culture sees sex as a fun physical activity, but the Bible tells us it is a gift from the Divine for married couples to enjoy and to unite them as "one flesh."

John Stonestreet of Breakpoint challenges Christians to embrace that truth.

"So what does all this mean for us, the people of God? At a minimum, it means that now is no time for the church to stop pretending that violating God-given sexual norms is innocuous. Now is not the time to change our views in order to be 'relevant' or 'heard.' The chickens are coming home to roost, you might say. We need to strengthen our voices about God's design for human flourishing, tell our young people as clearly and consistently as possible that sex is a beautiful gift of God intended for marriage—that is, that permanent union of male and female, which is intended as a picture of Christ and His Church. And we need to be quick and ready with the offer of Christ's redemption to any life broken by these lies of the sexual revolution."
