Dear friends, the U.S. Constitution is under attack like never before. That includes attacks upon the First Amendment which protects the right to the freedom of religion and freedom of expression from government interference.

If we lose these freedoms, we could be jailed for criticizing, commenting, teaching and informing others on issues that are in opposition to the government.

As you may know, conservative organizations and individuals including Franklin Graham, Jim Dobson, American Family Association and Family Research Council have been targeted by the Internal Revenue Service

# 'Open hostility' to Christians in U.S. military and to you and me

"Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. II Timothy 2:3

This verse isn't addressing war on the battlefields with guns and bombs, but the spiritual battles we fight in daily life. Right now warfare – spiritual warfare – is being fought behind closed doors as those in power surreptitiously create policies against Christianity.

Note this prophetic warning written in 1990 from Christian leader Dr. James Dobson:

"Bloody battles are being fought on a thousand fronts, both inside and outside of government. Open any daily newspaper and you'll find accounts of the latest Gettysburg, Waterloo, Normandy, or Stalingrad.

Instead of fighting for territory or military conquest, however, the struggle now is for the hearts and minds of the people. It is a war over ideas. ... For now, the outcome is very much in doubt. ..."

This war is one that significantly targets the heart and soul of the U.S. military and, congruently, each and every one of us.

Rear Admiral William Lee recently stated at a National Day of Prayer event: "Leaders like myself are feeling the constraints of rules and regulations and guidance issued by lawyers that put us in a tighter and tighter box regarding our constitutional right to express our religious faith."

There are many recent examples of the military targeting Christians, as commentator Todd Starnes reports:

- •An Army briefing labeled Evangelical Christians and Catholics as examples of religious extremism linking them to Al Qaeda and Hamas. In another incident, an Army officer warned that the Family Research Council and American Family Association were domestic hate groups.
- •A War Games scenario at Fort Leavenworth identified Christian groups and Evangelical groups as being potential threats;
- •A 2009 Dept. of Homeland Security memorandum identified future threats to national security coming from Evangelicals and pro-life groups;
- •A West Point study released by the U.S. Military Academy's Combating Terrorism Center that linked pro-lifers to terrorism;
- Christian prayers were banned at the funeral services for veterans at Houston's National Cemetery;
- •Bibles were banned at Walter Reed Army Medical Center – a decision that was later rescinded;
- •Catholic chaplains were told not to read a letter to parishioners from their archbishop related to Obamacare mandates. ...

And the most recent, quoting from Worldnet Daily:

Last month, Pentagon officials met with an activist committed to removing Christianity from the U.S. military.

Michael "Mikey" Weinstein, the head of the Military Religious Freedom Foundation, has called the practice of Christians in the service sharing their faith "spiritual rape."

Now Weinstein wants the Pentagon to vigorously enforce an existing policy against proselytizing in the military. The Pentagon responded by issuing this written statement:

"Religious proselytization is not permitted within the Department of Defense," the

Pentagon statement read in part. "Courtmartials and non-judicial punishments are decided on a case-by-case basis."

A firestorm then erupted amid fears of courtmartials for service members who share their Christian faith, and the Pentagon was forced to backtrack in an effort to quiet the protests.

"Service members can share their faith (evangelize), but must not force attempts to convert others of any faith or no faith to one's beliefs (proselytization)," Pentagon spokesman Lt. Cmdr. Nate Christensen said in a written statement.

That's not good enough for retired U.S. Army Lt. Gen. Jerry Boykin, who is now executive vice president at the Family Research Council.

"We'd like to get a statement saying exactly what assurances Mikey Weinstein did get from the Air Force," Boykin told WND. ...

Activists like Weinstein argue any Christian witnessing should be off limits, while others say it should only mean service members cannot pressure or coerce others to convert.

"If they will tell us that and give us the assurance that living their faith and sharing their faith is a protected right then we'll be satisfied," said Boykin. ...

If the pattern of religious hostility persists, Boykin says young people and their families will simply decide military service is not worth the assault on their values....

# NBC's Hannibal – ratings plummet, station drops

As news broke recently of the abhorrent 10-year-long kidnapping/rape/torture of three Ohio girls (now young women), we as a nation were shocked and horrified at such abject depravity and cruelty perpetrated upon them by their captor, Arial Castro. As some of the gruesome details have come to light of what these young women endured, it is almost too sickening to read, let alone imagine withstanding for 10 years. We are still stunned by man's inhumanity – the capability of unimaginable evil.

While support for Amanda, Gina, and Michelle has been widespread, the anger toward Arial Castro has been equally universal. Numbers have voiced the retribution they'd like to see inflicted upon this torturer, Arial Castro.

Now imagine if Hollywood were to produce a television show entitled "Arial Castro" featuring a glamorized, sympathetic portrayal of this sicko. Yet, in essence, NBC's "Hannibal" is doing exactly that – glorifying a fictional murderer who tortures his victims. "Hannibal" is centered on fictional psychiatrist Dr. Hannibal Lecter who helps the FBI solve cases, even though he himself is secretly a cannibalistic serial killer.

I've never seen a network television show in which evil is portrayed so benevolently – where the killer is actually one of the main characters, the sophisticated and genteel Dr. Hannibal Lecter. The character is written in such a way as to sway viewers to relate to, even sympathize with Dr. Lecter, even though viewers know that this psychopath tortures and kills his victims – then serves up their body parts as "haute cuisine" for

his unwitting dinner guests.

We are rightly outraged by the torture and horrific cruelty inflicted by Arial Castro, yet many people turn a blind eye to shows such as "Hannibal" which not only desensitize viewers, but can even encourage "copy-cat" crimes committed by twisted individuals.

The secular elite, however, not only doesn't make the connection of the deleterious impact of "Hannibal," they actually praise the show for its "artistry," as this Yahoo entertainment reviewer writes:

"... The cinematography on this series is amazing, leaving bizarre images imprinted in the brains of the viewers and taking them on a freakish journey into the minds of serial killers. Some of the images are grotesque, but in a surprisingly artistic way. ..."

Grotesque in an artistic way?? The writer is correct on one point, however. "Hannibal" does leave its gruesome images imprinted upon brains of undiscerning viewers. What will be the impact upon those who are "entertained" by such depravity?

The good news is that Hannibal is seeing its own ratings die. Relatively few people in America want to tune in for gruesome violence as they curl up on the couch with a bowl of popcorn. The premier episode on April 4 saw decent ratings (especially for the ratings-desperate NBC), but since then the ratings have taken a nosedive. The last two weeks drew only a very dismal 1.0 ratings share in the coveted 18-49 year old demographic, with only 2.5 million viewers overall. In comparison, for the same time slot CBS drew 9.5 million viewers and ABC had 8.13 million viewers.

Not only have the ratings for this disturbing show been flat, but one TV station has refused to air anymore episodes. NBC affiliate KSL-TV in Salt Lake City stated:

"After viewing the past few episodes, as well as receiving numerous complaints from viewers, KSL TV will cancel the airing

of the NBC show "Hannibal" on Thursday evenings. This decision was made due to the extensive graphic nature of this show."

"... "We don't make programming decisions lightly, and we want to listen to our viewers, who have called and emailed our station — and also responded with low viewership. This show has been called one of the most violent, bloody shows on TV by The Salt Lake Tribune. Thank you for your feedback — we're reading them all."

KSL vice president of marketing, research and promotion Tami Ostmark told the Salt Lake Tribune: "This is beyond anything we've put on our station before. This is too graphic to be on regular TV. It should be a cable show. We've talked to NBC, and that's how we feel about it."

While most secular entertainment reviewers have given "Hannibal" an enthusiastic thumbs up, it seems as if the review that <u>really</u> counts –people tuning in to watch – is giving the show an overwhelming thumbs down.

We encourage you to do as hundreds of viewers in Utah did. Call your local NBC affiliate and urge the station to cancel the graphically violent "Hannibal."

# Corrupt to the Core: What is Common Core and How does it Threaten the Next Generation

Educate. The word itself comes from the Latin "ex ducere" – to bring out or lead forth. Lead forth or bring out from what? The etymology gives the idea of a rescue or liberation of the one being educated. Indeed, that is the basis of Western Civilization – that liberty is built on knowledge and the more you know, the freer you are.

#### It is ironic, then, that the latest push in education from the federal government is such a threat to personal freedom.

You have perhaps heard whisperings of the "Common Core" curriculum being adopted by most states for their public and charter schools. On its face it sounds like a good idea – a national standard of knowledge that every school kid in the country will be expected to meet by the time he or she reaches college age. It's just that the people who developed, paid for, and pushed the curriculum all have much more than that in mind.

The most obvious problem with Common Core is the centralization of power in the education system. If a parent has a problem with what their child is being taught, they could not join a group of concerned parents and bring the problem to the school board. It would be equally useless to lobby the state board of education. In order for a parent to have any effect on what their child is being taught, they would have to find thousands of parents around the country with which to network and then just hope that the powerful developers of the curriculum could be brought around to their point of view.

And, unfortunately, homeschooling or private schooling will most likely not provide an escape from the long reaching arm of the Common Core, as it will require students to pass a particular test to graduate in the states which adopt it. Thus, students will have to be taught the "correct" answers to those tests, even on issues like global warming and government healthcare.

Is a parent's right to oversee their child's education a worthy trade for that child being prepared to enter a prestigious institution of higher learning? It is an irrelevant question, as Common Core reportedly is not designed to prepare kids for an Ivy League school, or even a four-year college, but for a two year community college.

In fact, the standard required by the Common Core is lower than that of many state's current standards. From StopCommonCore.com, an excellent resource for those wanting to dig deeper into Common Core's frightening consequences, "Dr. James Milgram, the only mathematician on the Common Core Validation Committee, refused to sign off on the math standards because he concluded that by eighth grade, they would place our students about two years behind those of the highest-achieving countries."

As for the Core's English standards (also from StopCommonCore.com), "the most serious problem with Common Core's ELA standards isn't the reading levels of the literature — it's the de-emphasis on literature, period. Common Core emphasizes "informational texts" to the detriment of creative literature. This means the Standards dictate that students spend most of their time — 70% — reading nonfiction such as technical manuals and court decisions. ..."

As reported by the Daily Caller, here are a few fascinating samples of the reading list,

• "Invasive Plant Inventory," by the CaliforniaInvasivePlantCouncil.Thisisjust a list of invasive plant species in California.

- "Executive Order 13423: Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy, and Transportation Management," by the U.S. General Services Administration....
- "Recommended Levels of Insulation," by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
- "FedViews," by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. This report from 2009 explains that the federal stimulus helped to stabilize the economy and asserts that there is no link between deficit spending and inflation.

As you can see, far from striving to produce creative, curious, and thoughtful students, the Core seems more set up to produce cogs in the machine of the national economy.

But even this is not the most concerning aspect of Common Core. A key aspect of the Common Core program is collecting data on the student level from kindergarten through college. This means that at any time during your child's education, a teacher or administrator or anyone with access to the database could type in your child's student ID and look up the child's performance in past grades, or how often he/she was absent, or why the child visited the school nurse.

That would be the same database described by Reuters this way in March, "In operation just three months, the database already holds files on millions of children identified by name, address and sometimes social security number. Learning disabilities are documented, test scores recorded, attendance noted. In some cases, the database tracks student hobbies, career goals, attitudes toward school - even homework completion.

Local education officials retain legal control over their students' information. But federal law allows them to share files in their portion of the database with private companies selling educational products and services.

### Homosexuality out of the closet, Christianity in

"Dare to be a Daniel,
Dare to stand alone!
Dare to have a purpose firm!
Dare to make it known."

Do you remember this rousing Sunday School song? I still remember standing with other Sunday School kids as we belted it out somewhere between "Do Lord" and "Deep and Wide."

In recent weeks, one sports celebrity was a Daniel – standing alone. And it wasn't NBA player Jason Collins who recently announced that he was a homosexual. Collins wasn't the one standing alone, because he had the vast forces of the secular army at his side. President Obama personally called Collins to congratulate him for coming out. Michelle Obama tweeted: "A huge step forward for our country." The list is endless as celebrities, athletes, and politicians lined up to give Collins a proverbial pat on the back.

As Sports Illustrated reported: "Collins' coming-out party was a joyous affair. He was praised in enormous measure. His announcement was called groundbreaking, epic, country-changing. At last count, his Twitter following had swelled from about 3,500 to nearly 85,000."

"Praised in enormous measure" for announcing that he prefers men for a sexual partner?

"...[T]here's a lot of Christians in the NBA and just because they disagree with that lifestyle, they don't want to be called bigoted and intolerant ... That's what LZ was getting at. Just like I may tolerate someone whose lifestyle I disagree with, he can tolerate my beliefs. He disagrees with my beliefs and my lifestyle but true tolerance and acceptance is being able to handle that as mature adults and not criticize each other and call each other names.

"... Personally, I don't believe that you can live an openly homosexual lifestyle or an openly premarital sex between heterosexuals, if you're openly living that type of lifestyle, then the Bible says you know them by their fruits; it says that's a sin. If you're openly living in unrepentant sin, whatever it may be, not just homosexuality, adultery, fornication, premaritals exbetween heterosexuals, ... I believe that's walking in open rebellion to God and to Jesus Christ. I would not characterize that person as a Christian because I do not think the Bible would characterize them as a Christian."

Broussard's Biblical statement threw the secularists into into a fit of un-righteous indignation. The gall of this Christian man to call their sin what it is!

Yahoo Sports writer Kelly Dwyer was especially outraged and couldn't believe that Broussard still clung to his out-of-date religious beliefs in 2013.

#### Dwyer wrote:

"Chris Broussard is allowed to say whatever he wants on any subject he wants at any time, such is his right as an American citizen. Whether his personal views on the subject of homosexuality were appropriate for this particular setting is a completely different story. Especially as an American citizen, one that does not live in a theocracy that creates laws and freedoms based off of a religious text. ...

"... be reminded of the fact that if you had sex before marriage, or have had sex and are not married, Chris Broussard thinks that you are a sinner that is in defiance of God, and he used the pulpit of a sports talk show to remind you of such. Do you like him saying those sorts of things about you?

Broussard is free to live his life as he sees fit, and admonish those that he sees as lacking in the face of his chosen god. We're also free to question the centuries-old influence that created this line of thinking."

Notice that according to Mr. Dwyer the viewpoints of American Christians are only "appropriate" to express in certain settings – and obviously not in a public discourse. That somehow because Broussard's comments about morality stem from

"religious text," the First Amendment doesn't apply to them.

Dwyer and countless others like him are telling American citizens who happen to be Christian – 'say whatever you like – as long as it's not in public.'

## "The New Normal" Cancelled - Falling Ratings for "Glee"

Glee's fourth season ended recently with the same tired, gay-agenda-pushing theme that has marked nearly every episode this season.

It should come as no surprise since *Glee* is the baby of the openly homosexual creator/producer Ryan Murphy. Murphy has a long history of shoving his agenda.

As you may recall, one of Murphy's other pet shows we monitored this past season was *The New Normal* - also promoting the gay agenda. On the surface, *The New Normal* was about two homosexual men who hire a surrogate to have a baby for them to parent, but in actuality the show's central focus was trashing Christianity and the traditional values held by millions of families.

Each week we asked our email alert readers to send a message to the advertisers who sponsored The New Normal. In addition, viewers who turn on their TVs to be entertained, not sermonized - tuned out the agenda-pushing The New Normal. Ratings for the show were So with little support, very anemic. NBC recently announced that The New Normal has been officially cancelled and will not return next season!

Yet *Glee* is a different story. In its first couple of seasons *Glee* was a huge ratings success. It was also more insidious – especially in the first season – of subtly propagandizing its audience. In a classic bait-and-switch, viewers were drawn in by

the catchy song and dance numbers, lulling them to overlook the growing attacks upon their values.

However, some of the proverbial frogs in the kettle are realizing the water is getting hot and are jumping ship. As Murphy has increased his push of the gay agenda on *Glee*, ratings have been steadily dropping.

It's also quite telling to read online comments from *Glee's* viewers. The following are a number of viewer remarks posted in response to a Yahoo entertainment story about *Glee's* season finale:

- Glee was great in the first two seasons. Music great with an anti-bullying theme. Now it is basically a gay program. Unless the producers change back to its original format, Glee is out the door.
- I remember when it was a fun show that showcased their musical talent. Now it's either an episode of teen angst or the writers expressing their liberal views.
- No longer about just good songs and competition, but the gay agenda is getting too much attention for me.
- This has become a homosexual show, and even my 9 year old daughter wondered aloud if there was something better on.
- PC Glee. I quit watching 2 yrs. ago. Nothing but proselytizing propaganda.
- We get it Murphy, you're gay and your agenda is gay. Season 5 will be one big gay orgy...
- I have watched this season, kinda sad that I couldn't let my daughter, we have always shared Glee but only after I previewed it. ... This season was strictly NOT for that age group. Don't complain about your numbers dropping when you change your audience. ... Don't know if I will give it one more chance.
- Stopped watching after season 2. Started becoming too gay. ... I felt like it was becoming a PSA or after school special being shoved down my throat.

- Glee is so heavy into social agendas ... Too much so for me. I stopped watching this show last year and I won't be back. The problem is, I loved the singing and seeing the talent.
- The show is just gay porn for kids.
- Like most shows the writers are pushing their liberal views... I used to like it as well.

The season finale of *Glee* featured a bisexual high school girl who has gone back and forth between having sex with boys and girls. She has now broken up with her boyfriend because, as she states, she's "missing sweet, sweet lady kisses." She says she's now a "lady lover."

Another major storyline is homosexual high school student Blaine who buys a ring to propose marriage to his "boyfriend" Kurt. He rejoices because homosexuals are "finally able to be legally married" -(at least in some states.) Blaine and Kurt befriend a middle-age lesbian couple -[portrayed by Patty Duke and the recently self-declared lesbian Meredith Baxter of "Family Ties" fame] - who mentor the teenage homosexual boys. The lesbian couple bemoan how discriminated against they have been, having to hide their "love" in years past. The scene ends with the two older women dining with Blaine and Kurt in a restaurant.
