God uses Cyrus to rebuild the temple, and when the builders laid the foundation of the temple of the Lord, the priests led the people with cymbals and singing – lifting up their voices in praise to the Lord!

Then these powerful words in Ezra 3:12-13:

But many of the priests and Levites and chief of the fathers, who were ancient men, that had seen the first house, when the foundation of this house was laid before their eyes, wept with a loud voice; and many shouted aloud for joy: So that the people could not discern the noise of the shout of joy from the noise of the weeping of the people: for the people shouted with a loud shout, and the noise was heard afar off.

I saw a clip of a massive crowd gathered at a Trump rally chanting "USA, USA" – with a large American flag in the background. My heart leapt as I saw the enthusiasm of those thousands gathered. I wept and rejoiced. Do you think many of those in attendance weren't experiencing the same thing? Oh yes, I think so.

America, though so deserving of the wrath of God, is yet a nation with many praying believers - burdened and sorrowful over the sins that beset our once great land.

- Antifa is routinely harassing and even attacking conservatives.

- A Republican senator [Rand Paul] was viciously beaten.

A State Going to Pot?

November 6 will soon be here and if one lives in Michigan they will be voting on the **legalization of recreational marijuana.**

There are several ways to view the legalization of this drug—societal safety, economically, politically, and religiously to name a few.

Since Colorado was the first state to legalize recreational marijuana, let's see how legalization worked out for them. They have data with which we can forcast what the good citizens of Michigan could reasonably expect to find in their state, in the years to come, if they should choose to pass proposal one.

From an **economic view**, Fortune reports that "in the 2016-2017 fiscal year, Colorado took in \$105 million in tax revenue from marijuana sales." That sounds good, but Gov. John Hickenlooper still **doesn't rule out recriminalizing it.**

There might be several reasons why Colorado would consider making marijuana illegal again. The one that Governor Hickenlooper points to is crime. "Since 2013, Denver has seen its crime rise as the national average has fallen. In 2016, the crime rate was up 4%, with violent crime rising 9%." Considering that marijuana was legalized recreationally in 2014, it's more than coincidental.

When it comes to societal safety, Governor Hickenlooper, gives warning to other states and their governors. As reported by the L.A. Times, "'We didn't regulate edibles strongly enough at first,'... He cited a spike in emergency room visits by kids who had eaten marijuana products and two cases in which young adults who had reportedly consumed marijuana edibles died — one after shooting himself and the other after

jumping off a hotel balcony."

If we are going to open up our state to legalized recreational marijuana and the infused products that naturally come with it - marijuana-infused foods and candies - I would hope that our lawmakers would have the foresight to develop and implement a strong infrastructure of regulations that would be consistently and stringently enforced.

There are a surprising number of "pot edibles" available to the public, which brings danger to unsuspecting children. Dr. Sam Wang, a physician at Children's Hospital Colorado, states, "Ingestion of edible products continues to be a major source of marijuana exposures in children and poses a unique problem because no other drug is infused into a palatable and appetizing form." This would explain the "increase in emergency room visits for kids under 9 who ingested pot after recreational shops opened." (L.A. Times)

Societal safety goes well beyond the children though. The Denver Post reports: "The number of marijuana-related automobile fatalities in Colorado, as measured by the drug's chief psychoactive ingredient, hit 77 in 2016, the latest in a series of sharp increases in recent years. Fifty-one of those drivers had levels of that substance, called Delta 9 THC, above the threshold for cannabis impairment under Colorado law.

"And according to a survey done by CDOT last year, just over half of marijuana users said they had gotten behind the wheel of a vehicle in the last 30 days within two hours of using the drug."

An article on "Teen Brains Hurt More by Marijuana than by Alcohol" states that "teens who smoke marijuana daily are 60 percent less likely to graduate from high school or college than those who never use - and seven times more likely to attempt suicide."

How does marijuana affect the workplace and coworkers? Occupational Health and Safety states: "Marijuana use has been linked to an increase in job accidents and injuries, and the National Institute on Drug Abuse notes that the short-term effects of marijuana include impaired body movement, difficulty with thinking and problem-solving, memory problems, and an altered sense of time."

"The drug impairs attentiveness, motor coordination, and reaction time and impacts the perception of time and speed. Studies from the National Institute on Drug Abuse have found that marijuana negatively impacts driving performance, and other researchers have found that acute use of the drug increases the risk of crashes and fatal collisions."

"Issues with attendance and productivity also can arise from marijuana use, and morale may be impacted."

"In the 1970s, marijuana had a content of THC (marijuana's active ingredient) of about 1 percent. Today, THC content is nearly 13 percent, and some strains are advertised as having a THC content of around 25 percent or higher."

Ironically, that \$105 million tax revenue is used, according to Fortune magazine, "to create housing programs, aid mental health programs in jails and contribute to health programs at local middle schools." I say ironically because CNN tells us, "The state's rate of homelessness rose 5.3% from 2013 to 2017, according to data from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. Nationally, the rate of homelessness dropped 8.6% in the same period." And The Gazette reports, "Harry Bull, the Superintendent of Cherry Creek Schools, said, 'So far, the only thing that the legalization of marijuana has brought to our schools has been marijuana.""

Politically, it's important to ask if this is constitutional. After checking with politicians and others who are scholarly about our Constitution, I find that there are no real clear answers. The consensus is that it is up to "We the People" of the state.

Let me be brief and blunt as we look at the spiritual aspect of this controversial subject. Although there are many verses one could point to, let us look at Ephesians 5:16-18, where Paul calls us to 1) Redeem the time, 2) understand the will of the Lord, and 3) be not drunk with wine, but to be filled with the Spirit. Here, the point is not the wine so much as the being drunk—or not in control of our full faculties. Perhaps oversimplified, but as I said, brief.

As I listen to proponents from both sides of the debate, there are very few of those in favor of marijuana legalization who make their case based on marijuana use itself. Either they want to point to the problems with alcohol abuse and misused prescription drugs or use the allowance of those substances as a reason for legalization. If one uses the argument that marijuana should be allowed because alcohol abuse is just as bad as or more dangerous than marijuana, or that prescription drugs alter one's mind as well, they aren't valid arguments. There are valid concerns; so let's address those issues rather than adding to them.

Legalizing marijuana just pushes the line for others to cross. Not all will, but many do. Remember when the speed limit was 65 mph? Some would drive 70 mph claiming that the police will give you a 5 mph grace window. But those who would not think of driving 80 mph then, easily do so now that the speed limit is 70 or 75mph.

I urge you to think about all the facts we have brought to light here. Are these things worth the legalization of a substance that hinders families, jobs, clear thought, and so on? It WILL affect our society and your family. Yes, the same can be said for other substances; but then let's deal with those substances. Let's not add to our troubles.

Who's Using What?

"Are you using your device or is your device using you?" veteran actor Denzel Washington asks. "Can you put it down? Can you turn it off?"

"What is the long-term effect of too much information?"

He continued, "We have to at least ask ourselves, 'What is it doing to us?""

The actor is referring to the constant connectedness made possible by the pocket sized internet machines that 95% of Americans carry around with us every day.

According to Pew Research, over two thirds of Americans use Facebook, not to mention the other social sites. Almost three quarters (74%) of Facebook users check the site at least once per day and 45% of users get their news from Facebook.

Are we using our phones or are our phones using us? Washington may have meant that to be a rhetorical question, but anyone who's paid attention to the outspoken tech insiders who have come out in recent years knows that the answer is incontrovertibly, "both."

When every service you use is tracking the way you use their service and selling that information to advertisers, you are a product using a product to make yourself a better product.

To quote former Facebook employee Sandy Parakalis, "Facebook is a fundamentally addictive product that is designed to capture as much of your attention as possible without any regard for the consequences... all of those consequences ladder up to the business model of getting people to use the product as much as possible through addictive, intentional-design tactics, and then

monetizing their users' attention through advertising."

The services we use are not just monitoring our use, they are feeding us particular information designed to make us use it more. Specifically, they purposely shepherd their users towards outrage, because outrage needs an outlet and the most convenient outlet is social media and when you visit the social media site you see the advertisements there and they get paid.

As Christians, that funnel toward fury and addiction ought to concern us for our own efforts to follow Christ, but that is not the only way that mobile devices can threaten to change their users.

Author Tony Reinke wrote a book entitled, "12 Ways Your Phone is Changing You," and in an article at DesiringGod.org, he sums up each point. Here are just a few:

We Get Addicted to Distraction
 We Crave Immediate Approval
 We Become Like What We "Like."
 We Get Comfortable in Secret Vices.

It's a wonderful article for Christians serious about using their devices for the glory of God, it can be found here: bit.ly/2yp4t7y.

I still use a Smartphone and have accounts with social sites, but it is helpful for me to be reminded by comments like Denzel Washington's to keep an eye on how I use it.

Am I leaning too heavily on Facebook posts to form my own opinions? Am I posting just to farm "likes" to feel good about myself? Am I maintaining digital relationships that would be inappropriate in the real world (and thus are in the digital world as well?) Am I using the curated images and articles on my phone to distract me from the real world messes that I am responsible for?

The internet can appeal to our most bestial interests and, in many cases, is designed to do so. Just like the real world, there is ample opportunity for sin, but even more opportunity to fulfill our creative purpose in glorifying God.

Taking a Hammer and Sickle to the Cross

"China, in many ways, represents the broadest, most complicated, most long-term counterintelligence threat we face," stated FBI Director Christopher Wray before a Senate Homeland Security Committee hearing. And, Wray ominously warned, "it affects every sector of our economy, every state in the country and just about every aspect of what we hold dear."

Homeland Security Secretary Kirstjen Nielsen, who also testified before the Senate, shared those concerns, stating: "China absolutely is exerting an unprecedented effort to influence American opinion. . . They're bringing everything they have to bear. They're playing a long game trying to influence us in every way possible."

In last month's newsletter we highlighted some of the growing threats China poses to our national security. Truly, the half has not been told. Communist China has been systematically infiltrating American companies and universities, engaging in cyber warfare and industrial espionage, and stealing military secrets. As you may recall, in 2015 China hacked the Office of Personnel Management and stole security clearance information of thousands of federal employees in a devastating cyber attack. And as the Washington Times reports: "Beijing has successfully recruited FBI agents and State Department employees as spies, and has used information from U.S. informants to kill more than a dozen CIA sources inside the regime."

A few recent examples highlight Chinese aggression. As China seeks to forcibly claim control of the entire South China Sea, a Chinese destroyer nearly collided with a U.S. warship after conducting a series of "increasingly aggressive maneuvers." Then on October 10, the Justice Department announced the arrest of yet another Chinese spy who

compromised U.S. aviation and aerospace companies. This followed an explosive report from Bloomberg Businessweek about the **espionage efforts** of a secret unit in the Chinese military which targeted the Pentagon, government agencies, and numerous U.S. companies by <u>slipping microchips into their computer servers</u>. This could allow Chinese military hackers to gain control over the servers and access all information. **The security implications of such hacking are massive**.

Vice President Mike Pence issued a strong indictment of China as he spoke at the Hudson Institute recently. "What the Russians are doing pales in comparison to what China is doing across this country," Pence said. "And the American people deserve to know it." In contrast to previous administrations, President Trump is not tolerating communist China's aggression.

But Chinese aggression doesn't stop at cyber warfare or espionage against the United States. As Vice President Pence went on to state: "And when it comes to religious freedom, a new wave of persecution is crashing down on Chinese Christians, Buddhists, and Muslims. Last month, Beijing shut down one of China's largest underground churches. . . For China's Christians, these are desperate times. . .

The Congressional-Executive Commission on China recently issued its Annual Report documenting in great detail China's abhorrent human rights and religious freedom record.

In recent years, Christianity has been rapidly growing within the communist regime. It's estimated that there are 67 million Protestant and Catholic Christians within China. However, as revival spreads, under President Xi Jinping, persecution is also growing.

As the Associated Press reports, the Chinese government is cracking down on Christianity, destroying crosses, closing down churches, burning Bibles, and forcing believers to sign a paper renouncing their faith. Chinese Communist Party officials have raided Christian homes

to remove religious symbols, arrested church members, and seized churches. In the Henan province, which has one of the largest Christian populations in China, over 7,000 crosses have been destroyed.

The suppression of religious freedom is part of an official campaign to "Sinicize" Christianity [to infuse with Chinese influence] by demanding loyalty to the atheist Communist party and removing any potential challenge to the regime's power.

The Rev. Bob Fu, a former Chinese house church leader, who immigrated to the U.S. in 1997 and founded the persecution watchdog organization China Aid, testified before the House of Representatives that the Chinese government is implementing a five-year plan to make Christianity more compatible with socialism in which there will be a "rewrite" of the Bible to include Buddhist and Confucian teachings and reflect Chinese ethics of socialism.

Fu also stated that state-sanctioned churches that have crosses on the inside must "put up pictures of Chairman Mao and Chairman Xi [Jinping] on both sides of the cross. In the beginning of every church worship service, the choir of the church has to sing a few communist revolutionary songs praising the communist party before they can sing the worship songs."

Over the last several months, local governments across the country have shut down hundreds of private Christian churches. One of them was led by Guo, a 62-year-old Chinese shopkeeper. In March, police officers and local officials suddenly showed up at the church on his property, dispersed the congregation and ordered that the cross, a painting of the Last Supper, and a displayed Bible verse be taken down. They ordered that all services stop until each worshipper registered with the government.

Such harassment is a growing and alarming trend. At many churches the government has banned children and Communist party members from attending and barred believers from being baptized. In March,

a prominent Chinese house church leader was sentenced to seven years in prison after he built Christian schools. And half a dozen Christians were sentenced recently to up to 13 years in jail. In Henan, on a single Sunday morning, 31 churches were shut down. All that is left of one house church is broken glass and torn hymn books strewn among the rubble of a knocked-down wall, after nearly 60 officials stormed the church without warning. Armed with chainsaws, they demolished the church and confiscated Bibles and computers.

How many of us would show up on Sunday if we knew we might be arrested?

It's hard for us comfortable American Christians to imagine what our brothers and sisters in Christ face in China and in many places around the world where persecution is a daily threat. We don't have to worry about being thrown in jail, having our churches demolished, or our Bibles confiscated. However, as the Body of Christ, we are called to: "Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated, since you also are in the body." Hebrews 13:3

Sunday, Nov. 4, is the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church when Christians throughout the free world pray in solidarity with believers who live out their faith in the face of harassment, attacks, imprisonment, and even death.

In addition to praying for our persecuted brothers and sisters, consider ordering the "Save the Persecuted Christians" banner listed on our response card to display at your church or home as a reminder to all who pass by of the suffering our fellow believers face and our call to support them and remember them in prayer.

The faith-filled movie. God Bless the Broken Road, tells the story of a young mother, Amber Hill, who loses her husband in Afghanistan and struggles to raise their young daughter in his absence. While paying tribute to those who serve in the United States Military, this film addresses the question of what do we do when we find ourselves on those broken roads in life? Who do we turn to? Where do we take our pain? Amber Hill never imagined she would find herself a widow and single mom. She feels robbed and is angry at God. She doesn't know how to help her 9 year old daughter, Bree, through her grief. And she's struggling with how to move on in all aspects of her life.

The movie, "God Bless the Broken Road," and the book it was based on, were written by Jennifer Graeser Dornbush, a native of Fremont, MI – also the home of American Decency Association. In fact, Jennifer's parents are good friends of this ministry!

Jennifer told us, When I was writing the script, I had two top take-aways always on my mind. First, that God is always with us, even if we don't feel like He is or aren't seeking Him actively. He is always there and He is always providing us with amazing blessings, even when/if we don't acknowledge them. One of the keys to healing and hope on our broken roads are to turn our gaze to Him so that we can start to recognize Him along the path. When we turn to Him and humble ourselves, He can start to guide us and shape our brokenness into blessing.

The second take-away is the importance of community. I believe in the necessity of building actual, physical, community (not just having virtual community). We don't have to travel our broken roads alone. God has given us friends and family to lean on for support and encouragement. This can make a huge difference when we are go-

ing through trying times. I think so many people suffer from depression and suicide because they think they are alone. Mother Theresa said the greatest poverty we have today is loneliness because we have forgotten that we belong to each other.

So many people feel like this. They feel alone. The feel that no one understands or cares what they are going through. What a travesty. It's so simple to be there for someone. You don't have to be a professional counselor or therapist to help someone heal from a wounding. Sometimes the very best thing is to just take a moment from your day to pause, listen, and lend a hug or word of encouragement.

On the flip side, if you are traveling a broken road it can be difficult to let people into your pain. We see this in "God Bless the Broken Road" in the character of Amber, who lost her husband in Afghanistan. It takes a lot of courage to be vulnerable and ask for help. But here's the secret... people love you and want to help you and be there for you. Amber eventually hits bottom in order to find this out and finally surrenders. It's at that moment when her life starts to really find hope and redemption. Needing to be loved and cared for is not a sign of weakness, it's the way we humans need to relate to one another to build real and lasting communities. By the way, building community this deep requires that you get off social media, look up from your phone and have actual human contact!
