

Does what you believe impact what you watch?

At our church, we have the Ten Commandments read to us each Sunday morning as we gather together as the body of Christ. The pastor makes it clear that the reason for doing so is to remind us that we are sinners in need of a Savior, and, that though saved, we need to look to Him each and every day for grace, mercy and assurance.

Many do not see themselves as sinful by nature. Many see themselves as basically good. I recall when I was a teacher in the public schools years ago having a conversation with a couple of teachers who were faithful church attendees. They were also over 25 years older than I. Somehow we got engaged in a conversation that resulted in our differences of opinion. Their view was that man is basically good.

Before I was saved, a pastor shared the Gospel with me. He tried to help me see that I was a sinner in need of salvation. I struggled at first as I didn't see myself as a sinner. As a short period of time passed, I realized that yes - I had lied, stolen, lusted, coveted. In my early 20s, I saw that that wasn't just my dilemma. By the grace of God, I saw that I couldn't remedy my broken ways and that it began at birth. I saw that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. [Romans 3:23].

Upon becoming saved, I almost immediately began to notice a change in my outlook. I began to feel increasingly uncomfortable with sinning, particularly as it related to looking at images that were not honoring to God, i.e pornographic images.

It isn't fictional. When we are truly saved, the Holy Spirit unites with our spirit and we are, indeed, born again. We are given spiritual eyes to see and to have spirtual understanding. It is true indeed. We are given a spiritual heart with spiritual eyes. The Holy

Spirit begins to work in our hearts, lives, and minds.

I felt conviction at looking at things that don't reflect a Holy God, my Heavenly Father. More and more I began to sense God's love for me. As I wanted my earthly father to be pleased with me, even more I did not want to damage my relationship with my Heavenly Father and break fellowship with Him by hypocritically saying that I love Him then knifing Him in the back with a lustful lifestyle.

God's Word and His standards became my standards. I found that He was giving me the internal power by His grace and Holy Spirit to overcome my addiction to pornography.

In short, I know what it means to be lost. I have had a glimpse of what it means to be living in sin with its infatuation with dark things. Living with fleshly impulses while being deluded that man is basically good is common to man.

Where does Godlessness lead? I could write a book on this subject with examples from loved ones and people I know who have self-destructed. You could too.

Godlessness, of course, is affirmed, accentuated, and accelerated by the imagery flowing non-stop across our American airwaves with increasingly degraded visuals, themes, and anti-God propaganda - with too many unwittingly and mindlessly following, desensitized, and deceived.

America has been in decline for a long, long time because we as Americans have turned our back upon basic Christianity beginning with the truth that we are sinners in need of a Savior.

If a person sees little value in the truth, what does that lead to? If a person sees little need to guard their heart, their eyes and mind, what can that lead to?

These are basic questions. These are pretty easy questions to answer because we know people who lie. We have known or know people who you just can't count on because their word counts for nothing. Saying one thing they do another. We all know of people whose marriages have been destroyed by unfaithfulness.

One of the things that burdened me so deeply about the battle for personal holiness when I was teaching in the public schools was the significant coarsening and worsening of television already in the 1970s and 80s. I was seeing little by little the coarsening of my students and the degrading of family life.

It didn't take a rocket scientist to see that children and adults were spending increasing amounts of time watching television.

Values were changing. Attitudes were changing. What we place before our eyes does impact.

Here is a quote that I found useful when I was doing a lot of speaking on this subject in the 1990s. It fits very well here.

America's most powerful influence makers have intensified their public relations blitz aimed at convincing Americans that homosexual behavior is normal and, more specifically, that homosexual "marriage" should be legalized.

In what USA Today has called "the gayest TV season in memory," network programmers -- subsidized by well-known companies -- have become more and more bold in their homosexual advocacy.

"It is amazing to see two gay weddings within a month on two big sitcoms. It seems like they're trying to push some buttons. Even in the gay community, a full-on same-sex marriage is a minority kind of thing," said Rob Greenblatt, executive vice president of development for Fox. "It is 1996, and little by little everybody has gotten a little less afraid of the old taboos."

When I was teaching I became increasingly concerned for the students I taught as I could see that television was having an increasing role in the shaping of their lives.

I could also see in the mid to late 80s that parents couldn't be counted upon to exercise good judgment in their own choices, let alone mentor their children's viewing.

Why was that and why is that still today? Because God doesn't matter in the vast majority of American households.

I didn't want to believe it. I was still naive. In the early 80s, I still was hopeful that the National Education Association Journal would have an article to encourage teachers to instruct their students to exercise discernment in what they viewed.

We all know how utterly naive that was even 30 years ago. Then, too, as a teacher in the public schools, I began to realize that the NEA wouldn't write anything like that because they held and promoted the view that what is pornography to one is art to another. This view, too, is fostered at secular universities throughout America.

So as a public school teacher I realized that my hands were tied. Though I could and did urge my students not to watch television and developed a very systematic and highly popular reading program encouraging my students to read at night, I was only one teacher.

I also knew that students throughout our country are not being equipped or encouraged to be discerning in their entertainment or reading choices.

In addition, I recognized that because of the relativistic philosophy flowing out of our public schools buttressed by the godlessness of our television and radio airwaves, our children and youth would not be equipped to see with discernment and truth.

Years have gone by. My worse fears have been realized.

Note the television monitoring reviews we publish monthly - including this month's review of *Sister Wives, My Five Wives,* and *Dads*.

Where are you and your loved ones in all of this?

There isn't a whole lot you can do about everyone else, but there is a lot that you can do about yourself and your loved ones.

First, though, it is of vital importance that you have the power of God's Holy Spirit in your life empowering you to have the capability of being able to discern the difference between the profane and the holy, to have the spiritual power to overcome the evil one and the hold of sin. Without Christ in our hearts, we won't will to do of His good pleasure.

Don't take this lightly, friends, for you and your loved ones. If you walk in darkness, you will choose darkness and wickedness will follow you all of your days.



My biological father is a rapist. I don't even know my ethnicity, but my life still has value and it isn't worth any less than any of yours just because of how I was conceived. And, I do not believe that I deserved the death penalty because of the crime of my father. All of my life I have had to listen to the rhetoric that every child should be wanted

and planned. I have heard people say, "I wouldn't have an abortion that would be terrible but if it were rape, well then...?" I guess that means that I am a "mistake!" I don't believe that. I believe that every child is wanted by someone, and I believe that God in His mercy had a plan for me.

Drawing from her personal story, as well as her visits with teens around the world, Pam talks about the consequences - both physical and emotional - of sex outside of marriage. It's been her experience that, if given the facts, today's young people are fully capable of making good, healthy decisions.

For years, Pam was on the "front lines" as Director of Alpha Women's Center, a counseling center for women undergoing crisis pregnancies. Over and over she heard from young women she counseled, "nobody told me" about God's design for sexuality and the consequences of not following His plan. Her experiences taught her that before teen pregnancy and STD rates could decline, attitudes of teens toward sex first had to change. Desiring to bring about that change, Pam started speaking nationally full-time and is in great demand both in the U.S.A. and internationally.

From Disgust to Acceptance

"Please continue your drive to get Sister Wives off the air. This show is promoting polygamy and these fans of theirs think that it is ok and the way to live. ... There are many people out there that think this is ok. They do not see the true picture of polygamy. They only see what the Brown Family shows them. ... I feel they are duping their fans. How can we get this show off the air. They had a huge number of advertisers for Sundays show." K.S. (ADA reader)

Now, in addition to airing *Sister Wives*, TLC has aired another show about polygamy – *My Five Wives*. TLC is pushing an obvious agenda - giving acceptance to that which is not only immoral, but also illegal. The purpose of these two shows is evident in the sympathetic portrayal of the polygamists and the soapbox given for them to defend their lifestyle.

"People still don't know that polygamist families are just like any other family." This was the claim by one of the so-called "wives" featured on a recent episode of Sister Wives as she appealed to viewers for "acceptance" of their tragic and degrading lifestyle.

Yet this is why we oppose Sister Wives – it is slowly indoctrinating viewers to see polygamy as "just like any other family." They buy the lies - such as this whopper from polygamist "husband," Kody Brown:

"One of the most important things for me, as we became a family was that we identified as a family. ... We have a covenant with each other between us and God and it is a marriage and we view it as a marriage. We don't view it as an open marriage. We don't view it in any way other than a biblically sanctified marriage."

They may "identify as a family," but that doesn't make them one. And they may "view it as a marriage," but it's <u>not</u> a marriage and it certainly isn't biblical or sanctified!

In Mark 10:6-9 Jesus stated, "But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 'Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate."

As Jesus taught, God's design for marriage is one male and one female – the two becoming one. NOT three, or four, or five individuals choosing to "view" themselves as being in the covenant of marriage.

Yet to millions of undiscerning viewers, the Browns' claim may sound reasonable. Without being grounded in the truth, they begin to accept such falsehood.

According to an Associated Press report, Brady Williams, the "husband" of the newest polygamist show, My Five Wives, claims: "... the increasing social and legal acceptance of gay marriage has helped society open up toward plural marriage"

Sadly, that is exactly what is happening in our culture. As we fail to defend marriage as God designed it, not only is gay "marriage" becoming legitimized, the door is also opened to polygamy and any combination of people one wants to "decide" is a "marriage."

Take a look at some of the comments posted online regarding this new TLC show, My Five Wives:

- Who are we to decide what is right and wrong. If this family is truly happy, than I say Good For Them! Too many people look for fault, not the positive side. Maybe there is something said for families with multiple spouses.
- For me one wife is great; however, if more than one works for you, than go for it. Gay marriage is now accepted so multiple

spouses, man or women, should be accepted.

- If they are all happy and willing consenting adults ... then who am I to judge?
- If gay marriage is to be legal, why can't polygamy be legal? Almost every single pro-gay marriage reasons out there can be used on a polygamous relationship.
- ... I don't see why it's anybody's business how they choose to live their lives. I would never in a million years choose to live that way, but to each their own.

'To each his own.' All of these comments sound very similar to the book of Judges when "everyone did what was right in his own eyes."

Thankfully, there is still a remnant that recognizes Truth. Some of these also posted comments online:

- That's how it goes. If you do not put your foot down to affirm One Man One Woman marriage you have no say in marriage what-so-ever.
- First no fault divorce, then gay marriage, now polygamy, coming soon incestuous marriage, pedophile rights, and interspecies marriage. You think the slippery slope is a crazy idea but 10 years ago gay marriage was called crazy too!
- ... Has anyone stopped to think for a minute the CHILDREN'S right to a NORMAL family? a FATHER and a MOTHER as it has been meant to be?
- Who says legalizing gay marriage doesn't impact society? The article itself said making gay marriage legal has now made it easier for polygamous relationships to gain acceptance. ... Wickedness of every kind is gaining acceptance where it never has before, especially in America. ... Satan knows his time is growing short to deceive and destroy the masses. He's influencing fallen humanity in every sphere. ...

"Dad's" - a new blight from FOX TV

It's not often I agree with the liberal elite entertainment writers. It's also not often that we see these same writers turn on one of the darlings of Hollywood. But sometimes garbage is so foul that even those with a deadened sense of smell will wrinkle up their nose at its stench.

Such is the case with a new sitcom on the FOX network, Dads. Dads is produced by Seth MacFarlane, creator/writer/producer of the debased animated shows Family Guy, American Dad, and The Cleveland Show. For longtime readers of this newsletter, you know we have targeted these degrading cartoons for years. It's no secret that these cartoons have nothing to do with "family" - other than to undermine the values taught by millions of parents. The specifics might vary, but the overall content remains the same. Rife with profanity, extremely vulgar dialogue, and gratuitous violence, each episode is a new variation of the same repulsive, sexualized theme.

Now FOX is airing MacFarlane's new show, *Dads*, which is equally degrading as his animated shows. In some ways that seems to make it worse –when "real" people - not animated caricatures – are setting such an vulgar example.

The criticism of *Dads* has been overwhelmingly negative. In fact after reading reviews from dozens of mainstream sources, I didn't find one positive review. For example, the liberal news website, <u>The Daily</u> Beast, offered this commentary:

It's a rudimentary sitcom premise, retreading setups and punchlines that became stale decades ago. Under the guiding mind of producer Seth MacFarlane, however, the show takes a misguided approach to spicing up that banality—by infusing those punchlines with an almost unfathomable amount of bigotry, racism, ageism, and off-color "humor." That's the source of the show's notoriety and the reason that Dads transcends status as a crappy series that should be ignored and allowed to die its probable quick death into a series whose very existence is a blight on culture at large and must be publicly shamed into dying a certain death.

At a pre-screening of the pilot episode for the Television Critics Association, FOX TV president Kevin Reilly begged the media to overlook the offensiveness of the show, stating: "... You know the lineage of these writers. They come out of 'Family Guy.' ... These guys are going to try to test a lot of boundaries. They are going to try to be equal-opportunity offenders."

In addition to the racist and crude content of *Dads*, the premiere episode also included a disgusting reference to child porn, in which a female character on the show was told by her employers to dress up as a "sexy Asian schoolgirl" to help win a client's business. After seeing her in the "sexy" little girl's outfit, the two male bosses ogle her and speak of fantasizing about her.

The Wall Street Journal wrote: "What makes 'Dads' so deeply and fundamentally racist is that it is MacFarlane's entitlement fantasy, in which the only cast members of color are women who exist to serve and service the spoiled little boys' club at the show's core."

As <u>The Daily Beast</u> reviewer so aptly wrote, Dads is "a blight on culture at large" and hopefully - will "be publicly shamed into dying a certain death." Contact FOX TV and urge them to pull the plug on Dads.

Miley Cyrus - the sexual exploitation of children

I guess Hannah Montana hasn't heard her old theme song enough. After years of playing a teenage rock star who strives to keep her celebrity status secret from her peers, Miley Cyrus has not only lost the "the best of both worlds," she's making some of us wonder which world she belongs to at all.

In case you're out of the loop, the formerly wholesome tween Disney star whom we have watched slowly fall from her teeny bopper pinnacle, has hit new lows with her performance at this year's MTV Video Music Awards and her latest music video.

Perhaps in an effort to become a "serious" musician like Lady Gaga (who wears dresses made out of meat!) Miley's latest music video features her riding on a wrecking ball. Naked. She also licks a sledge hammer. I'm not sure, but I think it's supposed to be art.

Then there's her VMA performance, in which she strutted on stage in a leotard with a teddy bear on it, later doffing it for nude underwear to sing about sex while sticking her tongue out and mistreating a foam finger. It seems that in a desperate lurch for the attention she had as Hannah Montana, Miley Cyrus is slipping more towards Marilyn Manson.

It's not so much the things that Cyrus does that are shocking. After all, the VMA's have been known for bringing out the sick side of performers (i.e. Madonna and Britney Spears kissing on stage and Lady Gaga's aforementioned meat dress). It's more so the whiplash we get while watching "aww shucks," Hannah Montana become "how tragic" Miley Cyrus.

But, if her goal is to get people talking, mission accomplished. Unfortunately for her, the talk is not exactly encouraging.

"... My eyes hurt. My ears hurt... It's like a... car crash and I just cannot avert my eyes. ... Who thought this would be a good idea?"

"... she's disgusting. honestly a disgrace to women kind."

"Uhhh I will never see her the same again. I feel bad for all the young girls that watch Hannah Montana if they ever see her how she is now"

That last comment fleshes out the real issue. Three years ago Wal-Mart sold sheets with this girls face on them in the little girls section! There were Hannah Montana backpacks and t-shirts and pencils and now those little girls' hero is humping demolition equipment. What are they to learn from that?

What they learn was recently exemplified by students from Grand Valley State University - 40 miles down the road from our headquarters. GVSU has displayed a modern art sculpture of a wrecking ball – called a bifilar pendulum. For over 20 years the "wrecking ball" pendulum sculpture has quietly hung suspended not bothering anyone – an innocuous college landmark.

That is, until Miley Cyrus filmed her recent music video of her naked self on top of a swinging wrecking ball. Once Miley's video was released, it took little time for some college-age "adults" to imitate the video - shucking their clothes, climbing on the giant pendulum sculpture, and swinging away as they belted out Miley's song.

As Miley's controversial nude music video vaulted her song to number one on the Billboard Hot 100 pop music list, the videos of the stark-naked students posted online also went viral. GVSU promptly removed the pendulum sculpture citing "safety reasons" and the story made headlines across the country.

Aside from safety and "sanitary" concerns of a group of puerile college kids vying for their 15 minutes of fame, there are far greater concerns regarding the sexualized example Miley Cyrus sets for teens – and adults.

Writing for Townhall.com, Mona Charen comments about the consequences of Miley's explicit displays: How many of Cyrus' young fans will interpret her behavior as a normal part of growing up? How many will confuse lasciviousness with sexual maturity? ...

However, Charen raises another concern about Miley's VMA performance. Since Elvis first swung his hips, many parents have recognized the impact of culture influencing the behavior of youth. But a growing trend is even more disturbing – the sexual exploitation of children.

[Miley] is hardly the first celebrity to attempt to shock her audience by shedding her ingenue image. ... But Cyrus did more than cast off her innocence. She used innocence itself as a lecherous come on.

Cyrus, 20, began her vulgar dance by appearing in a teddy bear costume with dancing teddy bears as back up. ...

I haven't ever seen child porn, but I would bet that a great deal of it uses images of innocence and childhood -- like teddy bears -- for the delectation of its audience. Cyrus has now taken this perversion mainstream.

Child porn, like every other kind of pornography, once relegated to a seedy underworld, is now as close as a cellphone. It's ... close to the surface of American lives, but kept from full view by the last remaining shreds of propriety that our culture enforces.

The existence of the Internet has probably already eroded some of the shame that pedophiles once felt. Learning that hundreds of thousands of others share one's perversion must be cathartic.

But how much more liberating to see the themes of child sexual abuse portrayed approvingly at the VMA awards?

American popular culture continues to prove that there is no rock bottom, and everyone who shrugs that it's no big deal is a little bit complicit.
